Respect for Others

Ages 5-7

1. Respect Drawing

Each of you make a drawing of people who are showing respect for each other.

2. Respect TODAY

Tell each other about how someone showed respect for you during the day.

3. Respect or Disrespect?

Draw 2 columns showing respect and disrespect. Then say some actions out loud and have your child decide if the action shows respect or disrespect for others. Write the action under the appropriate column.

- *hitting someone*
- *taking a friend's toy*
- *helping someone who is hurt*
- *making friends with a new student*

4. Respect Story

Together write a short story where one person shows respect for others and another person does not show respect for others. Read the story to family members.

5. How We Feel

Make a list of how each of you feels when someone shows respect for you. Each of you can also make a drawing that shows how you feel when you are respected.

STORY WISDOM

Finding Life Lessons in Children's Stories

1. Discuss characters in a story who showed respect and disrespect for others and the results of their actions.
2. Discuss how characters who were respected or disrespected could have felt in a story.
3. Discuss if any characters in a story learned to treat others with respect.



MEDIA WATCH

Understanding Media Messages

1. Discuss some characters on a TV program and whether they treated others with respect.
2. Discuss the words of a children's song and whether the song encourages people to show respect for others.
3. Discuss if a video game your child plays shows respectful attitudes towards others.

DINNER DISCUSSIONS

Discussion Ideas for Meals Together

1. Without using names, discuss people that family members know who do not show respect for others. Discuss what these people do and how they could show more respect.
2. Have family members talk about times when they felt disrespected by someone else.
3. Each family member explain what he/she can do to show more respect for others.
